



Lee Jackson was one of the founding members of Youngstown All Breed Training Club. Before the club was established, several people met and trained their dogs at Pioneer Pavilion in Mill Creek Park. They later moved to GF Hall on Logan Avenue in Youngstown to train.

Lee spent many hours and much of his own money to keep this club active. He was known as "Mr. Youngstown All Breed" and served as president of YABTC for 18 years. Lee was also president of Mahoning Shenago Kennel Club. Lee was an AKC judge and one of 3 people in the nation to receive the distinguished 1977 Midwest D'Ambris award. Unfortunately Lee passed away before he could receive the award.

Both Lee and his wife Kay competed in obedience with Dachshunds and Belgian Sheepdogs. Kay also was Trial Secretary for many years. They had three dogs titled as Companion dogs. Lee had a good sense of humor and had one of his wire haired Dachshunds registered with the name of "DAMMIT"

March of 1978, in honor of Lee Jackson the first Lee Jackson award was given in tribute of him and has become a yearly tradition of YABTC. This award is given to and outstanding and dedicated person who has served our club in honor of Lee Jackson.

2019 Lee Jackson recipient has been a member since 2005. Since joining the club this member has been very active and willing to help where ever she can. Always willing to listen and come up with possible solutions when we have issues.

She did Obedience registration for many years,



In HONOR of: UKC CH HONEYS VALKYRIE ZIGGY STARDUST, RN,TD2,OAP,AJP,NFP,DN,CGC,TKN.

10-28-2006 to 3-15-2019

Ziggy died unexpectedly from pneumonia after a 4 day illness, at the age of 12 1/2 years.

Ziggy was an Exceptional Dog from the beginning. After having five shorthair Weimaraners and being down to just one (due to old age) it was time to look for another.



This time I took a chance and chose a longhair pup so I would have to learn new sports and activities, besides just conformation, like with my previous Weims. There were 3 longhairs to choose

from in the litter (from 2 shorthair parents). I preferred a pup that had a blocky head and body, but after talking with the breeder, she suggested the male with a lot of coat, that was very outgoing and kept coming over to me and making eye contact (with a hound type head).

I intended to put numerous titles on him, to prove, that a

coat disqualification in the AKC Show ring, does not affect his abilities as a Weimaraner. So Ziggy, was my choice. The name just came to me, plus he had a blaze of white on his chest (stardust) and he became Ziggy Stardust. Getting him was the BEST decision I ever made in my Life!

Due to his coat and undocked tail, he attracted a lot of attention. I even had a couple of shirts designed to say, "I'm with the LONGHAIRED WEIMARANER (recessive gene)".

This was easier than constantly explaining what he was. (Especially walking around the IX-Center, while trying to shop at the Shows in December.)



He was so easy to train and usually learned it, on the second try. His abilities made up for his handler's shortcomings. Our journey began with tracking training, with the help of Judge, Rosemary Janoch, who took a fancy to him. In May of 2007 the Weimaraner Club of America, was having their Nationals in Cranberry, Pa and I wanted to take him with me, since I was going and taking a friend's shorthair to be shown. Rosemary said it was too soon to

enter him in tracking since he would just be 6 months old then but suggested entering him in Rally, that I knew nothing about. She said to get a book and you have three weeks to learn. So I entered him in rally (at least he could be on the grounds and I could scratch, if needed). Well, guess



what? He did compete and took 1'st Place, at 6 months of age, beating all the adult Weims. (No photo in WCA Magazine due to his disqualifying coat but his name was listed.) All 3 legs were completed in a row and titled June 2007.

Ziggy's journey continued with his CGC and Tracking Dog Title before 1 year old. Due to acquiring other dogs (his brother Schultz, May 2008 and daughter, Crystal, Jan 2011) we did not compete for any other titles till after he was 8 years old.

We always took agility classes for fun but didn't start competing till then. He started competing in agility at 8 and retired at 11 1/2 yrs old, earning OAP, AJP and NFP. Other Titles achieved were: UKC Show Championship, Dock Novice and Novice Trick Dog Titles (all after age 8).



He, not only was Handsome, but very Loving. Before competing at agility trials, we had to walk around so he could get lovin' from all his friends (this also prevented him visiting trial workers while running). There is a void in my life and heart without him. But I need, to proceed, with his daughter,

Crystal (8 yrs) and 2 granddaughters, Starr and Ruby (2 1/2 yrs).

The reason for this Tribute is to let everyone know, that they can accomplish so much with that SPECIAL DOG, if they put their heart and mind to it. These sports helped us BOND TOGETHER, so much more, than I could have ever imagined.

I MISS YOU, LOVE YOU and WILL NEVER FORGET YOU, MY HAIRY BOY AND SOULMATE, ZIGGY! REST IN PEACE!

OHIO UPDATE: Department of Agriculture Announces Suspension of Enforcement on Broad "Pet Store" Interpretation

Today the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) announced that they will suspend enforcement of a recent regulatory interpretation that would have required home-based dog breeders to obtain licensing as a pet store.

ODA has stated they will work with the Ohio General Assembly on a resolution.

The American Kennel Club worked with a number of policymakers regarding this issue. For more information about AKC's concerns, see a letter to ODA expressing <u>AKC concerns with ODA's interpretation of the definition of "pet store" and its impact on home-based breeders.</u>

AKC thanks the ODA for suspending enforcement on this issue and will continue to work with legislators for a permanent legislative solution. We will continue to

Judge's Orders – Command Discrimination

The orders are: "Leave your dog" and "Back to your dog." The judge must use signals for directing the handler to command and/or signal the dog to change position except for the first position and that order is: "Stand your dog" or "Down your dog." The procedure is clearly explained in the *Obedience Regulations*.

DO NOT USE VERBAL orders for position changes after the first initial position change, which is given when the handler is standing with the dog sitting in heel position. When the handler is in front and away from the dog, your verbal order greatly increases the dogs chance of responding to you, which is often times the same verbal command the exhibitor uses, which then results in a non-qualifying score.



CBD Oil for Dogs: What You Need to Know

As with any pet wellness trend, when it comes to CBD oil for dogs, there's a lot of information floating around online. Of course, you want to do what's best for your pup, which leads to the question: What are the need-to-know facts regarding CBD oil?

The <u>AKC's Chief Veterinary Officer, Dr. Jerry Klein</u>, explains what CBD oil is, what it does, and its safety concerns and side effects. What Is CBD Oil?

CBD, or cannabidiol, is a compound found in cannabis and hemp. Dr. Klein says it is essential to note that in most cases, CBD does not contain delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), the compound that gives marijuana its psychoactive properties. In fact, most CBD products are derived from **hemp** and *not* from marijuana.

How Does CBD Affect Dogs?

Currently, there has been no formal study on how CBD affects dogs. What scientists do know is that cannabinoids interact with the endocannabinoid receptors located in the central and peripheral nervous systems, which help maintain balance in the body and keep it in a normal healthy state.

What Afflictions Can CBD Treat?

While there's no definitive scientific data on using CBD to treat dogs, there's anecdotal evidence from dog owners suggesting it can treat pain, especially neuropathic pain, as well as helping to control <u>seizures</u>.

According to Dr. Klein, CBD is also used because of its anti-inflammatory properties, cardiac benefits, anti-nausea effects, appetite stimulation, anti-anxiety impact, and for possible anti-cancer benefits, although there's no conclusive data on this use.

The AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) is <u>currently</u> <u>sponsoring a study</u>, through the Colorado State University's College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences that will evaluate the use of CBD in treatment-resistant epileptic dogs. The CHF hopes that this will be the first study to gain scientific data on the use of CBD in dogs with this condition.

Possible Side Effects of CBD in Dogs

While there's no scientific data on the side effects of CBD usage for dogs, there are potential side effects based on how CDB affects humans.

• **Dry mouth:** Research has shown that CBD can decrease the production of saliva. For dogs, this would manifest as an increased thirst.

- Lowered blood pressure: High doses of CBD have been known to cause a temporary drop in blood pressure. Even though the drop is small, it might create a brief feeling of light-headedness.
- **Drowsiness:** Dog owners have used CBD to treat anxiety. The calming effect of CBD can also cause slight drowsiness, especially when using higher doses.

Risks of Using CBD

The safety and risks of using CBD for dogs have not yet been researched. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has not approved CBD and has not issued a dosing chart. Therefore, we do not know what size dosage would be toxic. Any medication or supplement carries the risk of a reaction. It is always advisable, when giving your dog something new, to start out with small amounts and then closely monitor the effects. And always check with your veterinarian first.

CBD Products on the Market

If you and your veterinarian decide that you should try CBD as a treatment for your dog, there are a few things to keep in mind when purchasing CBD oil. Not all oils are the same; you'll want high-quality CBD oil to have a better chance of it working.

- Look for organic. If the CBD oil is not organic, it at least should not contain pesticides, fungicides, or solvents.
- **Don't price shop.** The higher the quality and purity, the higher the cost. You don't want to go for a cheaper option that could have toxic substances such as pesticides, herbicides, or heavy metals. Make sure your CBD oil is free of additives.
- Get the analysis. The manufacturer should provide a certificate that tells you the amount of CBD that is in the product. Many CBD oils contain only small amounts of CBD. You'll also want to make sure there is little or no THC in the product.
- **Buy CBD as a tincture.** You can buy dog treats containing CBD, but the best form to administer is a tincture. This way, you can adjust your dog's dose drop by drop.

The CBD Trend

Why are we hearing so much about CBD oil now? Dr. Klein points to the legalization of marijuana in many places, which has triggered interest in marijuana-related products. "We are likely to see continued interest in CBD and an increase in research about its uses and efficacy in the coming years," he says.




