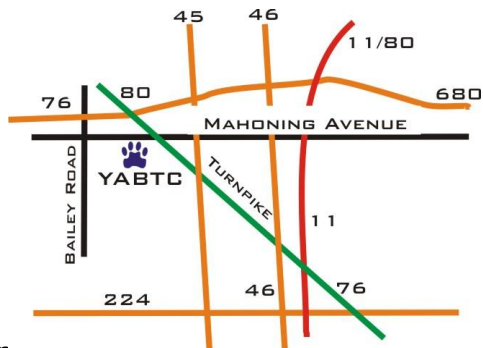


- ◆ Easy access to and from hotels and major highways. Most are located at the SR 46 and SR 80 exit.

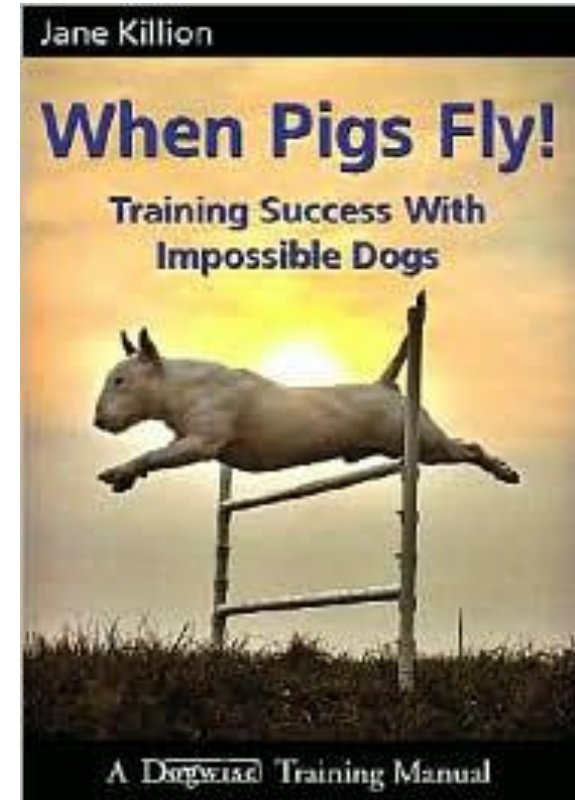

About the Presenter

YABTC is proud to have Jane Killion here for a two day When Pigs Fly seminar!!!!

Jane Killion is the author of the book, When Pigs Fly: Training Success With Impossible Dogs (Dogwise Publishing), as well as a popular series of Articles in Clean Run by the same name. Her dogs have appeared in magazines and on television and she has contributed several dog-training articles to various publications.

Jane's passion is helping people who have been told that their dog "just has an attitude" or is incapable of learning. She has had great success showing people how to find agility success with their canine companions by shaping new behavior.

4 Seminar Sessions

1. Pigs Fly basics and Introduction to free shaping behaviors

Introduction to free shaping agility and obedience behaviors - After a brief presentation on what free shaping is and how to do it, workshop students will have the opportunity to try free shaping with one of Jane's dogs. Students pick a behavior out of a hat and then each get to free shape it while the rest of the class watches. After that we move on to the students rotating through stations and freeshaping their dogs to do basic agility and obedience foundation behaviors. The seminar ends with a "Freeshaping Tournament" where students race against each other to freeshape the same behavior. (Saturday - 8:00 to 12:00)

2. "Issues" seminar for agility

The students call the shots on this one as they declare their "issue" and the class collectively talks about how to set up a session to work on that issue. This is the seminar to iron out all the issues that have been holding your team back. Each person has the opportunity to set up a session to address a specific problem. course in the most efficient way and what skills have been holding your team back.

General fear, distraction, or motivation issues are appropriate, as are specific obstacle performance or other "hot buttons," such as running to visit ring crew, weave pole issues, fear of other dogs/people, slow or refused contacts. Emphasis on learning to manage your dog and learning how to set up sessions outside of class to work on your dog's issues on your own. (Saturday -1:00 to 5:00)

1. Pigs Fly Agility Handling and Course Analysis 1

Your dog has to have 100% confidence that he knows where he's going in order for him to remain in drive. Being able to read a course and handle it consistently and fairly is key to motivating your Pigs Fly Dog. A good portion of the reason why some Pigs Fly Dogs become unmotivated is that their handlers fail to read the course correctly and find themselves re-directing and calling off their dogs. Learn how to read, analyze, walk, and run an agility course with ANY dog. Learn how to tailor a course strategy to your dog, not some perfect dog you don't have, while still maintaining a professional and consistent handling system. (Sunday 8:00 to 12:00)

2. Pigs Fly Agility Handling and Course Analysis 2

Prerequisite: must have taken either the morning session on Sunday or have taken a Course Analysis session given in the past. This includes previous auditors or those with a working spot.

Continuation of the information learned in the morning session
(Sunday -1:00 to 5:00)
